



The Evolution of Planning Thought

Cliff Hague is Emeritus Professor at Heriot-Watt University in Edinburgh, and works as a freelance researcher and consultant, mainly in European Union-funded projects and the European Observatory Network for Territorial Cohesion and Development (www.espon.eu). He is also the Chairman of Built Environment Forum Scotland (www.befs.org.uk), and a Past President of the Royal Town Planning Institute (RTPI), and of the Commonwealth Association of Planners. He is a member of the UK's Academy for the Social Sciences. After graduating as a geographer, he did a post-graduate planning course then worked briefly in Glasgow as a planner implementing the comprehensive redevelopment programme. His academic career was spent in teaching undergraduate and post-graduate planners. He was one of the founders of the Radical Institute Group, which, for a decade from the mid-1970s, had a strong presence on RTPI Council and significantly reshaped education policies. In 2001-02 he was a member of the RTPI's Education Commission. During the 1980s and early 1990s he developed research contacts in Czechoslovakia and Hungary. In 1992-94 he was involved in developing a Master's degree in planning at Lahore, and became interested in rapidly urbanising countries. He co-authored *Urban Challenges: Scoping the State of the Commonwealth's Cities* (2010). He is co-author of *Regional and Local Economic Development* (2011) and *Making Planning Work: A Guide to Approaches and Skills* (2006). He co-edited *Place Identity, Participation and Planning* (2004) and authored *The Development of Planning Thought: A Critical Perspective* (1984). He has recently been doing work on small towns in Scotland. He led the work on SP=EED, the Planning Aid for Scotland guide on community engagement (<http://www.planningaidscotland.org.uk/page/87/SP-EED.htm>). For almost 20 years he wrote a monthly column in *Planning magazine*, and currently writes a *World View* blog on www.CliffHague.PlanningResource.co.uk and another international blog about planning and development on www.innovationcircle.net.
