Professor Rachelle Alterman is the Founding President (2007-2010) of the International Academic Association on Planning, Law and Property Rights. She holds two degrees from the University of Manitoba (BA Hon in social science and MCP in planning), a PhD from the Technion – Israel Institute of Technology, and (after the PhD), an LLB from Tel Aviv University. With this trans-continental and trans-disciplinary background, Alterman specialised in cross-national comparative analysis of the relationship between planning law, land use regulations, property rights and planning practice. She has published 6 international books, over 100 academic papers, and has been invited to speak at conferences and seminars in over 30 countries. Alterman is a member of the Editorial Boards of leading international academic journals. In July 2012 the Association of European Schools of Planning, in its 25th Anniversary celebration, bestowed on her its highest distinction - Honorary Member (the 5th person thus honoured). She holds a chaired Professor rank at the Technion – Israel Institute of Technology, in the Graduate Program in Urban and Regional Planning. As an expression of her wide international recognition, Rachelle has served as a visiting professor at major American and Dutch universities.
